Now Elijah confronted King Ahab, “As surely as God lives, the God of Israel whom I worship and serve – there will be no dew or rain during the next few years unless I give the word!” [1 Kings 17:1 \(NLT\)](#)

Then the Lord said to Elijah, “Go to the east and hide in the Kerith Ravine. Drink from the brook and eat what the ravens bring you, for I have commanded them to bring you food.” So Elijah did as the Lord had told him and camped beside Kerith Brook. **The ravens brought him bread and meat every morning and evening** and he drank from the brook.” [1 Kings 17:2-6 \(NLT\)](#)

But after a while the brook dried up, for there was no rainfall anywhere in the land. [1 Kings 17:7 \(NLT\)](#)
