But he knows the way that I take; when he has tested me, I will come forth as gold. Job 23:10 (NIV1984)
2. Job encounters a God who has come to restore him.
Then the Lord answered Job out of the storm. He said: "Who is this that darkens my counsel with words without knowledge? Brace yourself like a man; I will question you, and you shall answer me. Where were you when I laid the earth's foundation? Tell me, if you understand." Job 38:1-4 (NIV1984)
3. Job no longer depends on about God, he now has first hand faith.
My ears had heard of you but now my eyes have seen you. Therefore I despise myself and repent in dust and ashes. Job 42:5-6 (NIV1984)
4. Job must do the hard work of before God prospers him.
After the Lord had said these things to Job, he said to Eliphaz the Temanite, "I am angry with you and your two friends, because you have not spoken of me what is right, as my servant Job has. So now take seven bulls and seven rams and go to my servant Job and sacrifice a burnt offering for yourselves. My servant Job will pray for you, and I will accept his prayer and not deal with you according to your folly. You have not spoken of me what is right, as my servant Job has." So Eliphaz the Temanite, Bildad the Shuhite and Zophar the Naamathite did what the Lord told them; and the Lord accepted Job's prayer. Job 42:7-9 (NIV1984)
5. Job experiences God's radical .
After Job had prayed for his friends, the Lord made him prosperous again and gave him twice as much as he had before. Job 42:10 (NIV1984)
